FFT History

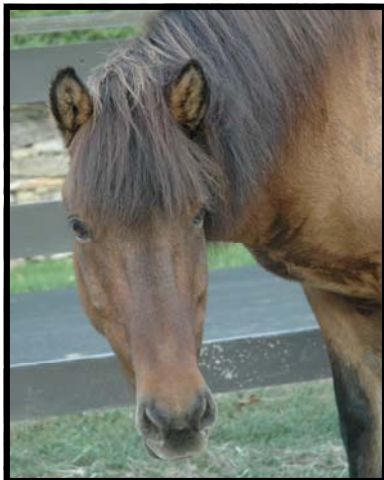

Our Lessons

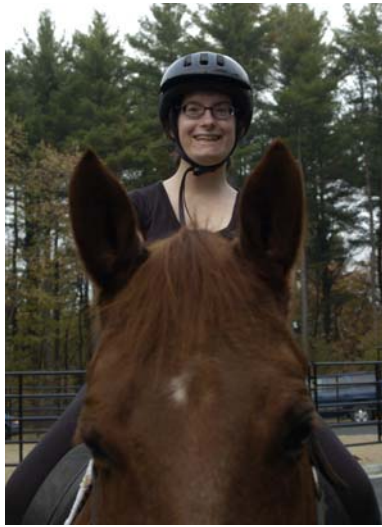


Each private lesson lasts forty-five minutes. Some of our students like to help groom and assist tacking up the horses, others would rather just get on and ride. 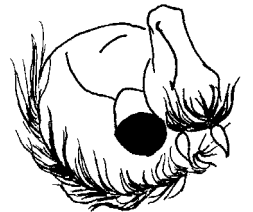
Volunteer Requirements
